Remote Learning

If directed by Public Health England or the DfE, we will close the school. In this eventuality, we have outlined an overview of expectations for home learning.

School will provide:

- Access to your child's Seesaw online learning journal
- Continued access to Times Table Rock Stars
- Continued access to Education City
- Any relevant activity sheets or booklets if required by your child
- An exercise book for children to record their work in

Teachers will:

- Set a maths activity each day (Mon-Fri)
- Set an English related activity each day (Mon-Fri)
- Ensure activities are at an appropriate level pitched to your child's ability
- Continue to set regular spellings despite being unable to conduct a weekly test (although parents/carers are free to do this)
- Review any work completed by a child and uploaded onto Seesaw. This will be completed at a set time each day decided by individual teachers.
- Be available to answer questions via Dojo or Seesaw between the hours of 9-11am, Mon-Fri.

Parents should:

- Contact school in the first instance if you do not have internet access, a smart phone or device or are having difficulties with the seesaw app. School will then provide a booklet.
- Access your child's seesaw learning journal to view the activities that have been set for them each day.
- Provide a space and time for your child to complete their activities, giving support where necessary.
- Provide your child with the necessary equipment e.g. pencil and paper.
- Support your child to upload a photograph of their completed activity so it can be reviewed by their class teacher.
- Encourage the children to read daily. They can read their own books, comics, magazines, recipes or instructions etc.
- Consider the advantages of teaching your child life skills e.g. loading the dishwasher, making a sandwich, washing the car!
