Pupil Premium Report 2024/25

1. Overview of Pupil Premium

- *The pupil premium is additional funding provided by the government to support disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. This funding is typically allocated to pupils eligible for free school meals, looked after children, and children of service personnel.*

2. Eligibility at Our School

- *For the 2024/25 academic year, there are no pupils on roll at Lindal and Marton Primary School who are eligible for free school meals and therefore do not receive this element of pupil premium funding. However, we do have a very small number of pupils who receive the Service premium and one looked after child. The funding received for these children is very specific to their needs and will therefore not be outlined in this document.*

3. Approach to Monitoring and Support

- *While there are no eligible pupils this year, Lindal and Marton primary School is committed to ensuring all pupils, regardless of background, achieve their full potential. We regularly review and monitor all pupils' progress and provide targeted support for those who require additional assistance.*

4. Use of Additional Resources
